And we most humbly beseech thee, of thy goodness, O Lord, to comfort and succor all those who in this transitory life, are in trouble, sorrow, need, sickness, or any other adversity; for the special needs and concerns of this congregation, especially Kathy, David C., Jimmy, Ted H., Amanda, Sherry, Jim, Jan, Nathan, Mark, Ken, Abigail, David, Nancy, Helen, Meredith, and anyone we name now silently or aloud. *(Here let us pause so that other intercessions may be offered.)* We pray also for those who care for them. *Silence.*

And we also bless thy holy Name for all thy servants departed this life in thy faith and fear, beseeching thee to grant them continual growth in thy love and service; and to grant us grace so to follow the good examples of Alban and of all thy saints, that with them we may be partakers of thy heavenly kingdom. *Silence.*

For the mission of the Church and for our own mission:

Lord Jesus Christ, give us the grace, the desire and the will to join you in your mission. May we CELEBRATE your goodness; INSPIRE others through our acts of caring and kindness; and SERVE any who are in need.



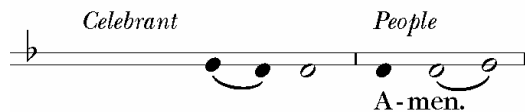

You are invited to stand or kneel at the railings; or to stand in the space between.


